Support your high street! Major roadworks are expected from April as Thames Water replaces its main water pipe that runs under Norwood Road between Tulse Hill and Knights Hill. The works are expected to run for 13 months and are essential for flood proofing our area.

West Norwood Cemetery has received a £4.6m National Lottery grant to save many of its listed monuments from ruin and support a series of exciting community activities. The grant, awarded jointly by the Heritage Lottery Fund and the Big Lottery Fund, will be topped up by £2.1m from Lambeth Council and the Friends of West Norwood Cemetery. Friends of West Norwood Cemetery hold guided tours on the first Sunday of every month.
